#### **RESOLUTION #4 OF 2024**

# AMENDING LOCAL LAW 6 of 2023 Extending a Townwide Moratorium for Renewable Energy Facilities and Battery Energy Storage Systems

**WHEREAS,** the Moratorium regarding Renewable Energy Facilities and Battery Energy Storage Systems was recently adopted by the Town Board and which is set to expire on/about March 19, 2024; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town Board for the Town of LeRay, New York is considering a number of steps to update, revise and amend its Zoning with regard to Renewable Energy Facilities and Battery Energy Storage Systems, but anticipates that completion of that process will not be accomplished by March 19, 2024; and

**WHEREAS,** in light of the above, the Town Board has determined that extending the moratorium for up to an additional three (3) months is reasonably necessary and appropriate to ensure that adequate time exists within which the Town Board might adopt reasonable amendments to Town Zoning in respect to Renewable Energy Facilities and Battery Energy Storage Systems.

**NOW BE IT RESOLVED**, that a public hearing Amending Local Law 6 of 2023 to extend the moratorium for an additional three (3) months (subject to earlier cancellation by Resolution) was conducted February 8, 2024; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that extending the moratorium to provide adequate time to amend Zoning in regard to Renewable Energy Facilities and Battery Energy Storage Systems is appropriate and the local law is approved; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

#### **RESOLUTION # 5 OF 2024**

# CONFIRMATION OF NEGATIVE DECLARATION(SEQR) RELATED TO WATERLINE CONSTRUCTION WITH EXTENSION OF CONSOLIDATED WATER DISTRICT

**WHEREAS,** the Town Board of the Town of LeRay, New York on/about May 13, 2021 adopted a Negative Declaration, Notice of Determination of Non-significance under the NYS Environmental Quality Review Act in its capacity as lead agency, advised involved agencies of that determination and published notice of the same in the ENB Region 6 Notice on/about July 16, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, the Consolidated Water District was extended pursuant to an Order of the Town Board of LeRay adopted May 13, 2021 and construction is likely to proceed shortly; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Engineers have undertaken considerable efforts to secure necessary consent from Real Property owners associated with locating a route for a portion of waterline; and

**WHEREAS**, a number of potential locations have been considered and the route has been selected and which is depicted on a Site Map attached as **Exhibit "A"** which is different from the originally anticipated location; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board in an abundance of caution is considering what aspect, if any, of its environmental review pursuant to SEQR should be changed, amended, etc. due to the proposed shift in location of the waterline; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board emphasizes the following relevant aspects related to the shift in location/route of a portion of the waterline:

- 1. The proposed location/route is still wholly within the existing district as extended;
- 2. The proposed location/route will not require any further district extension/amendment;
- 3. The proposed location/route is wholly within the lands within which the underlying SEQR review was previously performed;
- 4. The proposed location/route is more removed from potential traffic and the general population near the original proposed route;
- 5. The proposed location/route is not within any identified wetlands nor is it expected to create any risk not otherwise considered during the course of the Town's "hard look" under SEQR pursuant to the coordinated review;
- 6. There has been no change in nearby land uses since the Town Board's SEQR review and issuance of a Negative Declaration;
- 7. The Town Board is not aware of, nor has it been advised of, any potential change in any environmental impacts associated with the proposed location/route and is not aware of any other relevant adverse factors for purposes of SEQR.

WHEREAS, the Town Board has reviewed the matter and is determined to proceed. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of LeRay, New York that:

- 1. The foregoing recitations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if set forth hereafter.
- 2. Based upon a thorough review and examination of the known facts related to the underlying project, and the proposed location/route of a portion of the waterline and careful review of all potential adverse environmental impacts, and the entire record and proceedings related to the project, the Town Board finds that the proposed location/route of a portion of the waterline in regard to the project is de minimis, will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment, and that a draft environmental impact statement will not be prepared and no additional SEQR review is necessary.
- 3. The underlying Negative Declaration incorporated herein by reference, is reconfirmed and readopted for the reasons stated in the earlier Negative Declaration.
- 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
