Call to Order

Proceedings of a Town Board Meeting held at the LeRay Town Municipal Office on October 13, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Supervisor Taylor who led the room in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Comments from the Floor

Mr. Lake made it known to the Board where he stood on his tenant's bills being relevied onto his property taxes. The Board made it known that those on the relevy list who did not pay their water and sewer bills as of October 24th, 2022 would be relevied onto the property taxes. Mr. Lake agreed with a Board member that it would be more accurate for him to keep track of past due accounts if he would receive all bills, his tenants paid him, and he then paid the Town.

Report from Jessica Jenack, Community Development Coordinator

Mrs. Jenack gave her monthly report. The Planning Board had a Public Hearing October 3rd for a preliminary/final review of a subdivision. Also discussed LeRoy Burnham site plan extension letter. The Comprehensive Planning Committee meeting was held on October 17th, 2022 at 1:00 p.m. The Planning Board has proposed a zoning update on Retail Convenience, a Local Law would have to be drafted for the update.

Report from Dan Young, Highway Superintendent

Mr. Young reported on Highway worked completed. Mr. Young updated the Board on pickup trucks, where the town is on the list and prices. Tandem axle Volvo will be available sooner than expected, they may want a letter of intent by December 2022. Mr. Young gave a rough estimate he was quoted to put steel siding on the old highway barn for about \$35,000, to give it a facelift.

Report from Timothy Barber, Town Engineer

Mr. Barber gave the Board an update on all projects currently in progress. The driveway paving has been done at the LeRay II water tower and the chain link fence will be installed within the month. The Pipeline improvement project is waiting on the easement, construction should begin by the end of October and be complete by the spring of 2023. The Consolidated water project design has been completed and will go out to bid in 2023. The Briant house purchased in the Village of Evans Mills is waiting on an abatement plan for the asbestos.

Report from Steve Marshall, DANC

Mr. Marshall gave his monthly report. Two (2) new fire hydrants were installed by North Country, one on Virginia Smith Drive and one near Candlewood, as they could not be repaired. DOF well needed a motor starter, and it took three (3) days to find one, it is back online but during the LeRay II tank fill it had to be shut off 3 times. Mr. Marshall worked overtime to make sure and get the tank filled and to monitor it. A curb stop had to be fixed in Water District 3 for Terry Zimmer as he requested to have his water turned off. Water District 4 was read but many had to be reread by hand due to defects in the radios. Every well that is in LeRay except for Irving and DOF are on a system that can read the depth of the well. Mr. Marshall would like to update these two (2) wells with VFD's (variable frequency devices). A VFD would allow the Town to operate the well pump at a lower speed when experiencing low water levels.

Report from Lee Shimel, Zoning Enforcement Office

Mr. Shimel reported that the ZBA met October 5th and Jenkins Solar was approved for there area variance. In November the ZBA will have 2 more area variances presented to them.

Report from William Vargulick, Town Assessor

Mr. Vargulick reported on litigations that are ongoing. He also brought to the boards attention a home that was classified wrong and wanted some guidance on what to do.

Report from Nathan Toutant, Clerk to the Supervisor

Mr. Toutant went over with the Board the changes he made to the 2023 Town Budget based off what was discussed at the October Budget Work session. The Board discussed adding three (3) poles and two (2) lights into the budget.
